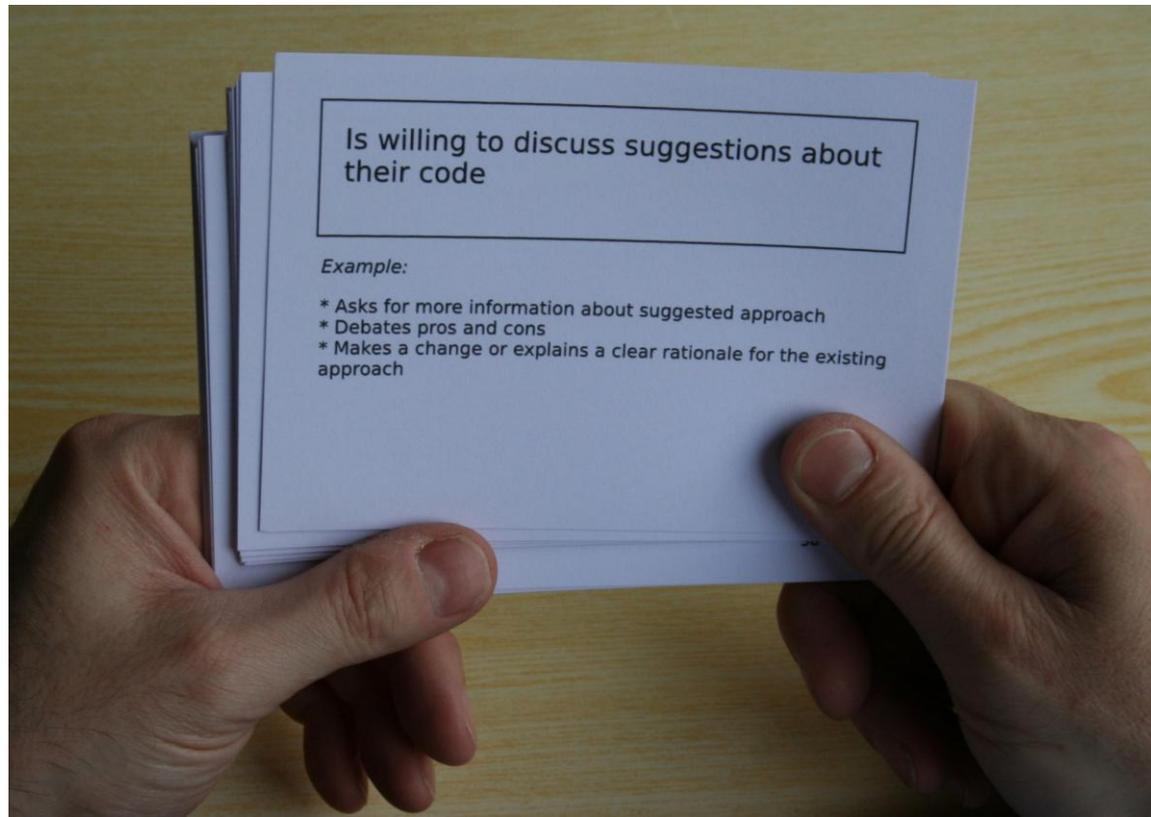
Is willing to discuss suggestions about their code

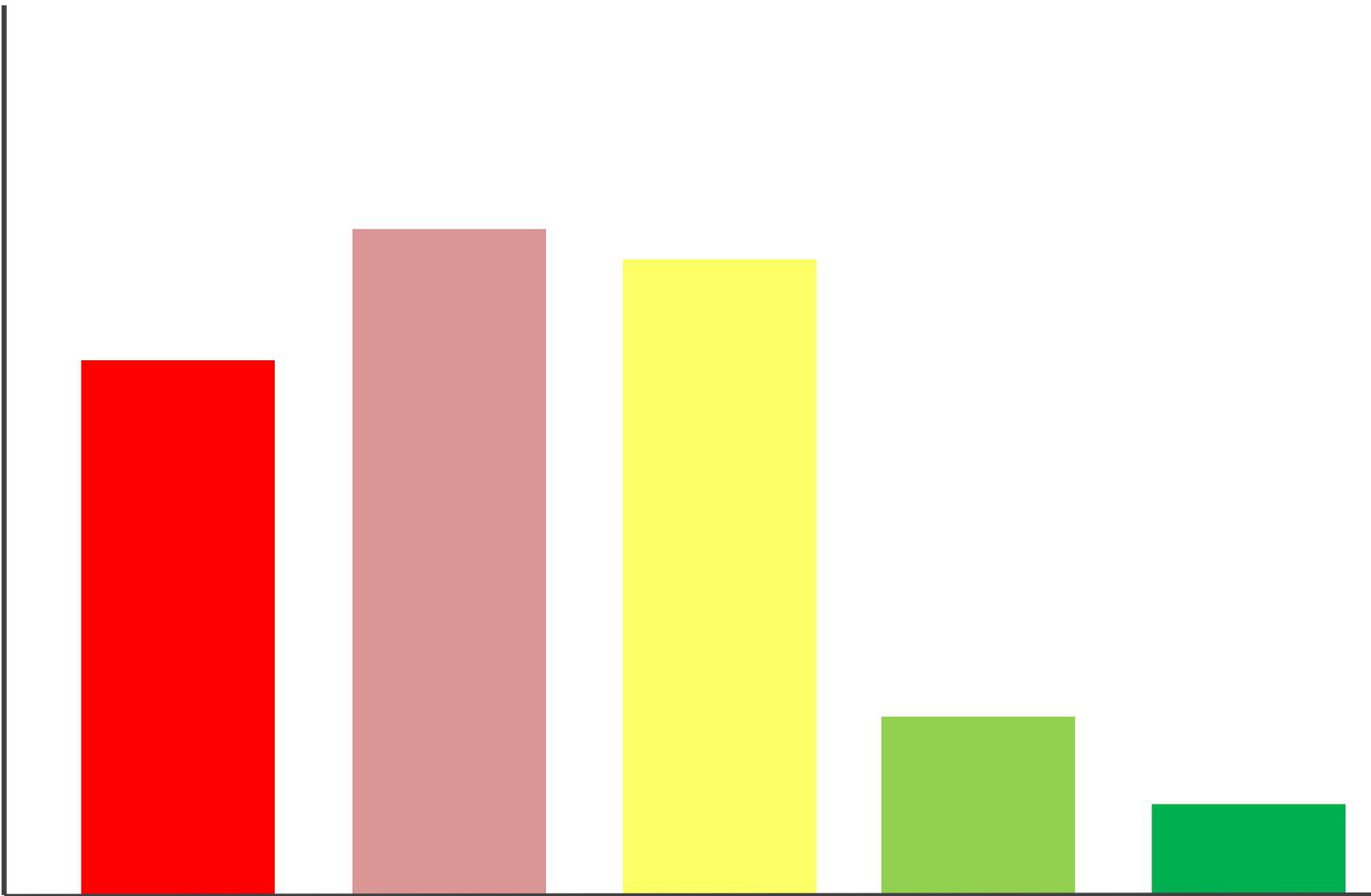
Example:

SUITABLE FOR
VEGETARIANS

SPELL IT OUT

Makes APIs easy to use correctly

Fixes bug symptoms without discovering
root cause

PRESERVE INFORMATION

Includes accurate details in bug reports
